

Ca-PRI 2017: Guidance for Oral and E-poster presentations

We are delighted with the large number of high quality abstracts submitted to Ca-PRI 2017. All abstracts were anonymised and independently peer-reviewed by three reviewers.

To mark this being the 10th Ca-PRI conference, we have decided to make the focus of the conference showcasing the research of the Ca-PRI community and so have taken a deliberately inclusive approach: all submitted research abstracts have been offered either an Oral or E-poster presentation.

This brings timetabling challenges – a good problem to have! – and so we have a number of Oral and E-poster parallel sessions. We ask all presenters to keep to their allocated time and help with the smooth running of the programme by sending presentations in advance for consolidating in preparation for the conference.

All presentations should use Power Point please.

Guidance for Oral presentations

There is one Plenary Oral session, and four Parallel Oral sessions over the course of the two days, each with three streams running concurrently in different rooms.

All Oral presentations are timetabled for 11 minutes, i.e. 9 minutes for presentation, with 2 minutes for questions.

Guidance for E-posters (Electronic poster) presentations

There will be *no* paper posters or poster walks at Ca-PRI 2017. Instead we will have three E-posters sessions, each with four streams running concurrently in different rooms.

Presenters will have strictly three minutes each, with a maximum of four slides, please do rehearse beforehand. Questions will be kept to the end of the session when the Chair will invite questions for all the presentations.

Please send your E-poster presentation to capri@ed.ac.uk by **Wednesday 12th April**. Please label your presentation with the surname of the presenter and the first few words of the title (e.g. Campbell Implementation of sustainable screening).

One of the strengths of Ca-PRI is the opportunity to network and talk to interested colleagues in more depth about a presentation, and this has often happened during the poster walks. As we will not have these this year, we instead will have a designated 'breakout room' where delegates can meet for discussion: if you wish, prepare a one page hand-out of your slides including your contact details that you can share with others.
