Scientific Abstract Submission Guidelines

Call for abstracts

Abstract submission is now open and closes on 19th January 2018

We invite abstract submissions for oral or e-poster research presentations, or for workshops. Please note there will be no paper posters at this conference but e-poster presenters are encouraged to have hand-outs of their presentations.

All submitted abstracts will be reviewed by the Scientific Review Panel. When they are accepted, they will be assigned to either an oral or e-poster presentation, or for a workshop.

Research presentations

We welcome abstracts that report findings from original research; all study designs and methodological approaches will be considered. Abstracts should be relevant to any component of the cancer control continuum, from prevention and screening through to survivorship and palliative/end of life care. Specifically, abstracts should address topics that are of relevance to primary care and cancer.

Abstracts should be no more than 300 words, in English.

Please structure your abstract:

- Title
- Authors (with presenting author underlined) *n.b. author names will be removed during abstract reviewing*
- Background
- Methods
- Results
- Conclusions

Workshops

Workshops are intended to showcase research ideas or results around a common theme, and should promote audience engagement and discussion. Workshops will be timetabled for 60 minutes.

Abstracts should be no more than 300 words, in English.

Workshop abstracts should clearly describe the content:

- Title of Workshop
- Aims
- Speaker(s) *n.b. speaker name(s) will be removed during abstract reviewing*
- Titles of any talks
- Target audience
- Audience engagement

General

- We particularly welcome abstracts from PhD and early career researchers
- We welcome abstracts from all health care settings.
- Decisions on abstract selection and assignment to oral or e-poster presentation will be made by end-February 2018.
